Learn more about local ecosystems in Jupiter

The gorgeous Loxahatchee River, Florida's first National Wild and Scenic River designated by the National Park Service, remains one of our best local treasures. If you'd enjoy learning about its ecological and historical significance, visit the River Center in Jupiter this weekend. The River Center features live aquatic tanks, interactive exhibits, and a touch tank that represents the entire Loxahatchee River system—from freshwater cypress swamp and seagrass-dominated estuaries to marine ecosystems.
